- The students teachers are losing interest from B.Ed. since its approach is 'Ideal' rather than realistic and addressing the present needs
- Hundreds of new web sites and you tube channels as well as video/audio materials uploaded
- Everyday a new research or a new method/technique of teaching-learning invented and it is very difficult to keep us up to date.
- ➤ The overall load of regular teaching-learning is so heavy that the student teachers and teacher educators get very less time for reading, research and innovation.
